# Neighborhood Watch News

From September to December, there were several reports of personal assaults near our neighborhood. In most cases, the victim was walking alone at night. With this in mind, we urge residents to take appropriate caution and avoid putting themselves in risky situations. Some safety tips from our Community Policing Report are below.

Neighborhood Watch meetings are held from 6:30-7:30 on the fourth Wednesday of each month in the Arcadia Elementary School library (enter through the side doors). Our next meeting is on February 25. These meetings provide an opportunity for residents to meet neighborhood enforcement officers and to report and hear about suspicious activities and violations. ## Community Policing Tips for Personal Safety

Avoid dangerous situations.

1. **BE ALERT.** Know where you are and what's going on around you. Keep your eyes, ears and hands open.
2. **BODY LANGUAGE IS IMPORTANT.** Keep your head up, swing your arms and stand up straight.
3. **WRONG PLACE / WRONG TIME.** Don't walk alone in unlit parking lots or pathways.
4. **EYE CONTACT.** When approaching someone, make eye contact. Eye contact may scare off a potential "attacker."
5. **BE PARANOID/SUSPICIOUS.** It's better to be safe than sorry. If you feel that you are being followed, call the police.

If you find yourself in a violent situation, the most important thing to do is react.

1. **CALL 911 IMMEDIATELY.** Report the incident to police as quickly and safely as possible.
2. **RUN.** Try to run towards a well-lit area where people or traffic may see you. Avoid areas where your chance of being seen is low.
3. **FIGHT BACK.** Hit the attacker where it counts. Move fast and forceful and be ready to flee.
4. **TRY ANYTHING AND EVERYTHING.** Don't give up. Offer your wallet or phone. Run into traffic. Make a scene.

## ARBORETUM IMPROVEMENTS

The notable development in 2008 was the completion of Arboretum Drive. Those of you with time and inclination could stroll or bike on the road while enjoying the quiet and restful nature of the surrounding land. Come this spring or early summer the road should be open for traffic.

Frank Szopo, the City Engineer, shared with me the following information: (1) The promised bike/pedestrian path, to run parallel to the road, will be completed before the new middle school opens in September. (2) Also on the agenda is the conversion of Kendall Ave. hill into a cul-de-sac. This change will greatly enhance the eastern part of the Arcadia neighborhood and help in our efforts to upgrade and revitalize it. This work will likely begin in the summer.

Finally, the City was considering a new traffic configuration where Howard, Solon, Kendall and Arboretum drive converge; one possibility was a roundabout. However, this is still in the conceptual stage and as far as is known, there will be no change at this four-way intersection at this time.
